



## SRC GFP Program

2008-2009

**As a SRC sponsored faculty, I have great opportunity to support the students who have strong motivations and excellent academic records on circuit design and power electronics in applying for the prestigious SRC GFP fellowship.**

**Eligibility:** GRC and Company-Named Fellowships are open to those students who:

- are US citizens or who have permanent right-to-work status in the U.S.
- are pursuing or planning to pursue a Ph.D. degree with research relevant to microelectronics under the guidance of a GRC-designated faculty member and under a GRC-funded research project. An exception is for students applying for the one-year fellowships as described in the Student Programs Brochure;
- are willing to provide a copy of his/her Ph.D. thesis to GRC.

Candidates will be considered for the award of a GRC Fellowship based on merit and without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, sex, or age.

**The Graduate Record Examination (GRE)** is required for all eligible candidates for the Graduate Fellowship Program (SRC Institution Code 2800).

**Fellowship tenure** begins with the fall term of the 2008-2009 academic year and is renewable, with satisfactory academic progress and recommendation of the Faculty Advisor, for up to four additional years.

**GRC Research Universities:** GRC Fellowships for 2008-2009 are tenable only at U.S. institutions of higher education having research contracts with the Semiconductor Research Corporation and only for doctoral research in conjunction with GRC-funded projects. Candidates must have applied for or been accepted in such a doctoral program at the time this application is submitted. GRC research universities and are listed in the SRC brochure "Student Programs;" names of faculty who are directors or principal investigators for such projects are listed on the GRC Web site at <http://grc.src.org/member/about/participatinguniversities.asp>.

**Privacy Assurance:** The information provided for a candidate's complete application will be used solely for selecting GRC Graduate Fellows and will be disclosed only to members of the selection panel formed for this purpose or to those officials responsible for the administration of the GFP. Aggregated data based on application materials may be used in management reports designed to evaluate the direction and progress of the program as a whole. Identification of specific data from individual applications will be avoided.
